

Q. It's been a while since Japan and your last victory and it has to feel nice?

BRANDT JOBE: It has. I guess, I had to play in Tour School last year to start out here and I won that, but other than that, it's been a long time. I think the last win I had was in --

Q. '98, they said?

BRANDT JOBE: Yeah, '98. Lost in a playoff out on tour and a couple close calls, but it's hard. You're out here to win, and I haven't done as good a job as I would have liked over the last -- especially when I was out on tour. Japan was great and I learned how to win, I just didn't do it. So this is nice. It's a little bit of a relief.

Q. What did you think when you looked and saw McCarron on the leaderboard?

BRANDT JOBE: I kind of laughed. I knew that's the way it would work out. He's playing good. I play a lot of practice rounds with him, and he's playing really good. I figure if anybody, the tougher the conditions, he's playing good, that would probably be the guy to come after me.

And I had to check the board on Kevin's shot right there. I didn't know where he stood, and I thought, wow, that was awesome. Quite a few fireworks there at the end.

Q. Seemed like you had your putter going today, seemed like you just made a lot of the putts that needed to go down?

BRANDT JOBE: I made four- and five-footers that I needed to make, yeah, which was nice. That's what you have to do to win. I hit a lot of good putts that didn't go in today, which would have made it a lot easier, but overall, I made the ones that you have to make to win.

Q. Are you glad you listened to Scott after the Senior PGA?

BRANDT JOBE: Yeah, how about that, I changed putters and win the next week, so go figure.

Q. How's it feel to put together three full rounds, not just one day here, one day there?

BRANDT JOBE: Yeah, it's good. Every round was solid. I mean, I figured today, 3-under in that wind was almost as good as yesterday because today was a lot tougher in terms of last four, five holes. You couldn't judge what the ball was doing anymore, and it was almost getting to the point where it was rolling. So it was very satisfying to go out and play a very

solid round to win.

Q. Is this justification for sticking it out as long as you have? You've played in a lot of events under this tour umbrella, and to be able to get a win finally --

BRANDT JOBE: Well, I don't know that there's ever justification. I think for me, it lets me know that the things I'm doing are good and keep doing them and good things will happen.

Q. You just changed your putter this week, it's your first time --

BRANDT JOBE: Yeah. Well, I've been putting with the putter for a long time, and last week I just was struggling so bad I went to something just to see something different, I went to a SeeMore putter. They sent me a different one that had the loft I was used to. That putter, that's the first time I putted with it this week.

Q. I imagine you'll be sticking with it?

BRANDT JOBE: Well, we'll see. I mean, if something's better. But I was very solid on the short putts.

Q. When you were walking up on 16 green, Scott had just teed off on 18. I thought I maybe saw a little exchange of a couple of words between you two. Was there anything said there?

BRANDT JOBE: Yeah, it was, "Good playing, but what are you doing to me?" We gave each other the thumbs-up. He played good. That's what he's supposed to do. That's how you want it. You want to win. Right now between Bernhard and Scott, those two are playing the best golf out here. So you want those guys to play well when you win a tournament, it means more.

Q. Given the length of time it's been since you had victories, what did you do to make sure you stayed mentally strong and focused down the stretch knowing what you had to do?

BRANDT JOBE: Yeah, I think honestly, you hear this, you try and stay in the moment, stay in your process. I knew where I was, I knew what I needed to do, hit some good shots, hit some safe shots at the end. Really, I played the last few holes just playing safe because it was so windy. It was kind of a maneuvering my way in and it all worked well.

Q. Particularly on 15, was the lie against the collar there a little bit?

BRANDT JOBE: Yeah. Billy Ray Brown told me that ball actually should have bounced on the green. It bounced back and I didn't have a very good lie, so I just kind of turned in a wedge to kind of almost blade it. You know, turned out pretty good, worked out pretty good.

Q. What was it like celebrating that with your wife there?

BRANDT JOBE: That's what's so cool. First week she's been here and I win this week. I guess she needs to be out here a lot more.
