Weather: Mostly sunny with a high in the low 90s. Wind from the SSW at 15-25 mph, with gusts up to 30 mph.

Brandt Jobe, 67-66 – 133 (-11)

- After a double bogey on No. 9, Jobe rebounded with birdies on Nos. 10-15 en route to a second-round 66.
- His string of six consecutive birdies is the fourth such streak on Tour this season. Jerry Smith, David Toms and Billy Mayfair each made six straight birdies at the Allianz Championship.
- His second-round 66 was his 18th straight round of par or better, which is tied with Jerry Kelly for the longest active streak on Tour.
- Through two rounds, he has hit the second most greens in regulation (31 of 36). On the season, he ranks No. 6 on Tour in this category (76.26%).
- Making his 32nd start on PGA TOUR Champions, Jobe will be a leader/co-leader going into the final round for the second time. He was tied for the lead after two rounds at the 2016 PowerShares QQQ Championship, but he finished T10 after a final-round 77.
- He finished tied for eighth at the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship, his second top-10 of the season. He is currently 22nd in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.
- He was college roommates with Scott McCarron, the winner of last year's Principal Charity Classic. They both graduated from UCLA in 1988.

Glen Day, 66-67 – 133 (-11)

- Day posted his second consecutive bogey-free round, and he is the only player without a bogey through 36 holes. Dating back to last year's tournament, he has played 47 straight bogey-free holes at Wakonda Club.
- His current streak is 48 straight holes bogey-free, dating back to the last 12 holes at the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship.
- Through two rounds, he has hit the most greens in regulation (33 of 36). On the season, he ranks No. 52 on Tour in this category (68.94%).
- This is the first time he is a leader/co-leader entering the final round. He will play in the final group for the third time in his PGA TOUR Champions career, and the second time this season. In April, he was T3 after 36 holes at the Mississippi Gulf Resort Classic and eventually finished T6 after shooting 72 in the final round.
- Day has two top-10s this season and is 41st in the Charles Schwab Cup standings. His best finish in 29 previous starts on Tour is a tie for fifth at the 2016 3M Championship.

Second-Round Lead Notes

- In the 16-year history of the Principal Charity Classic, eight second-round leaders/co-leaders have gone on to win: Jim Thorpe (2001), Don Pooley (2003), D.A. Weibring (2004), Gil Morgan (2006), Jay Haas (2007, 2012), Nick Price (2010), and Mark Calcavecchia (2015). Weibring and Haas (2007) are the only wire-to-wire winners.
- So far this year, a leader/co-leader heading into the final round has gone on to win four out of 10 tournaments.

Other Notes

- After **Bernhard Langer** holed out for eagle on No. 4 and birdied No. 5, he was 9-under and led by two. The lead was short lived, as he bogeyed Nos. 7-9, 14 and 17 and settled for a second-round 71. He is T7 at 7-under.
- Langer is coming off back-to-back major wins and if he wins this week, he would be the first player to win three consecutive starts since Fred Couples in 2010. The Principal Charity Classic is one of just 11 tournaments on this year's 26-event schedule that Langer has not won. (Of those 11 tournaments, he has not played in two of them.)
- **Kevin Sutherland** was 1-over through seven holes, but made four birdies on his last 11 holes en route to a 69. He is third at 9-under-par and will play in the final group for the third time this season. At the Tucson Conquistadores Classic, he entered the final round T3 and finished T7, and at the Chubb Classic he started T2 and finished T6. His career includes 30 top-10s in 64 starts, but he has yet to enter the winner's circle.
- Playing in his second PGA TOUR Champions event, **Steve Flesch** is 8-under and tied for fourth after shooting a second-round 67. He turned 50 on May 23, and in his debut at the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship, he missed the cut after rounds of 72-77.
- During his PGA TOUR career, Flesch had four victories, the last of which was at the Turning Stone Resort Championship in 2007. His career winnings of \$18.4 million ranks No. 37 on the all-time money list. He missed the cut in his only start of the 2016-17 season (Sanderson Farms Championship), and he made three cuts in six starts in 2015-16.
- **Tom Lehman** opened with nine straight pars and closed with five back-nine birdies en route to a 67, his 17th consecutive round under-par at the Principal Charity Classic. Lehman has finished in the top-10 in all five of his starts at this tournament. He is currently T4 at 8-under.
- **Michael Bradley** carded his second straight round of 68 and is T4 at 8-under. In six starts this season, his best finish is a T27 at the Mitsubishi Electric Classic, and he is currently No. 79 in the Schwab Cup standings.
- Defending champion **Scott McCarron** is T7 at 7-under after shooting a second-round 70.
- With the wind gusts of up to 30 mph, the second-round scoring average (71.833) was 1.128 strokes higher than the first round.
