**Today** – A stalled front will remain situated over northern Iowa during the day with the highest rain chances focusing north of Des Moines. With that said, a few showers may affect the area during the afternoon, but coverage should stay limited. Instability will remain minimal, so the lightning threat is low. Southerly winds are expected throughout the day with gusts of 15-20 mph possible during the afternoon. Forecast Rainfall: Less than 0.10" **Sunrise: 5:41am / Sunset: 8:44pm**

**Extended forecast** – A stalled out frontal boundary is expected to remain draped across Iowa through Sunday. Shower/T-storm chances have been lowered tonight with the bulk of the precipitation now expected to remain over northern Iowa. The front should remain relatively inactive during the day Sunday before increased development takes place Sunday night into Monday morning. Wind direction remains difficult to predict given the close proximity of the front, but a southerly wind may persist through the day Sunday before turning northerly late Sunday night.
